Had Been Confined to His
Home For Several
Months

Was 68 Years, 6 Months and
27 Days Old at Time of
Death

WIFE AND FOUR
CHILDREN MOURN

Funeral Services Held Last
Saturday From Home
and Church

Adolph C. Jensen, who has lived in Turner county continuously since 1893 passed away at his home in Viborg, Wednesday morning, May 25, at 10:30 o'clock, at the age of 68 years, 6 months and 27 days.

Mr. Jensen was born at Mosbjerg Sogn, Wendsyssel, Denmark, October 28, 1858. He immigrated, with his parents, to America in the spring of 1873 and the family settled at Racine, Wisconsin. On July 3rd, at Neenah Wis., he was united in marriage to Amalia Sorensen and they returned at once to Racine where Mr. Jensen was working. Six children came to bless this union, one a daughter, died in infancy; Harvey, who passed away three years ago at Shelby, Iowa, Arthur of Harlan, Iowa; Walter C. of Centerville; Calmer of Viborg; and Christine, Mrs. William Zimmel of Sioux Falls. Mrs. Jensen, the four children, eight grandchildren and two brothers, Dr. Julius Jensen of Chicago, and Charles Jensen, of Kenosha, Wisconsin, and a sister, Mrs. P. M. Brin of La Cross, Wisconsin, remain to mourn the loss of husband, father and brother.

When Mr. and Mrs. Jensen came to South Dakota, the country was comparatively young, and they labored for twenty years on the farm to make a home for themselves and their children. They retired and moved to Viborg to make their home in 1915 and Mr. and Mrs. Jensen have lived there ever since.

Mr. Jensen had been ailing for some time past and the family were not unprepared for his passing. He was of a jovial nature and even until the day before his demise he kept up his courage and was of good cheer.

This community, where Mr. Jensen has lived so long, knew him well, and he, with his good nature and cheer, will be sadly missed by the many whom he called friend.

The funeral took place Saturday, May 28th, from the home in Viborg and the M. E. church. The interment was made at the Baptist cemetery, Rev. Hofstedt officiating, assisted by H. M. Andersen and C. E. Peters. The sympathy of the entire community goes out to the bereaved family.
