FUNERAL SERVICES ARE HELD FOR ARTHUR FLYGER

Arthur J. Flyger, son of Fred and Lillian Flyger, was born at Viborg, S. D., on December 11, 1888.

He grew up in the Spring Valley community and attended school there. When a young man he worked as a telephone line-man for the Flyger Central Exchange.

On April 22, 1914, he was united in marriage to Mabel F. Madsen of Salix, Iowa. To this union two daughters and two sons were born—Mrs. Ardell Zastrow of Hurley, Mrs. Max (Muriel) Gors of Sioux Falls, Fred W. of Viborg, and Arthur, Jr., of Sioux Falls.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith and was a member of the Hurley Lutheran Church.

During his lifetime Mr. Flyger was engaged in farming in the Parker and Hurley areas.

Following his retirement from farming in 1946 he moved to Hurley where he owned and operated a cafe for a time. He continued to make his home in Hurley until November of 1974. Since then he has resided with daughter Ardell at the Good Samaritan apartments in Sioux Falls.

On August 18, he entered the McKennan Hospital where he passed away on August 20, 1975.

He was preceded in death by his wife, his mother and father, and three sisters.

He is survived by his children; six grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Myrtle Knudsen of Viborg and Mrs. Gladys Anderson of Ruth-ton, Minn.; a number of nieces and nephews, and a host of friends.
