**ANDERSEN BABY  
FUNERAL TO BE  
THURS., MAY 20**

Robert Lee Anderson, three months old son of Mr. and Mrs. Johnnie Anderson, died Monday evening May 17, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. E. Anderson. Death came as a result of double pneumonia.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday at 1:00 P. M., at the parent's home, a few miles northeast of Centerville, with a service following at 2:00 P. M., in the North Lutheran church in Viborg, with Rev. Einer Romer and Rev. Gisselquist officiating. Interment will be held in the Bethany cemetery, west of Viborg, with K. L. Raynie directing funeral arrangements.

Robert Lee Andersen, little son of Mr. and Mrs. John Andersen, was born January 29, 1937 at Viborg. On March 7 he was baptized at the Bethany Lutheran church here. He was a healthy child, full of life and thriving well until about a week before his death when he contracted a cold that developed into double pneumonia. This proved to be too much for him; and in spite of the best of care and medical attention that he was given at the home of his uncle Wm. Andersen, here, where he had been taken, he passed away Monday evening, May 17, at the age of three months and 19 days.

About three years ago he was preceeded in death by a brother, Gordon. His death is mourned by his parents and two little sisters, Joan and Ardell, and a large number of relatives and friends of the family.

The funeral was held Thursday afternoon from the John Andersen home, 12 miles east and one mile south from Viborg, and from the Bethany Lutheran church here, the pastor, Rev. Einer Romer, in charge assisted by Rev. Gisselquist. Interment was at the cemetery three miles west of town. The services were attended by a large gathering who had assembled to express their sympathy to the bereaved family. Many had sent flowers, and six contributions were made in memory of little Robert Lee to the church missions.
