## **FUNERAL SERVICES HELD FRIDAY FOR DEWEY PAULSON**

Funeral services for Dewey Paulson were held last Friday, Feb. 18, 1972, at the State Veterans Home at 10:00 A.M. with Chaplain Peter Dahlberg officiating. Mrs. Peter Dahlberg was soloist. Pallbearers were: Glen Norbeck, Henry Kellar, Allen Junso, Edward Omerson, Ernest Swanson and Harry Kunsler. Military rites were held at the Black Hills National Cemetery, Sturgis, S. D., at 1:30 P.M.

Dewey Paulson, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul C. Paulson, was born Nov. 23, 1898, in Viborg and was raised and went to school here.

Dewey enlisted in the Navy in the First World War, staying there for four years. He was drafted into the Army on Sept. 8, 1942. After coming out of the Army he went to work at Todd's Shipyard at Seattle, Wash., where he worked until 1945. He then went up to Fairbanks, Alaska, where he spent some years before coming back to the States. In 1968 he entered the Veteran's Home at Hot Springs, S. Dak. Dewey spent a month at the hospital where he passed away Tuesday morning, Feb. 15, 1972.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul C. Paulson; five brothers, Willie, Magnes, Robert, Iner, and an infant brother; and one sister, Lillie Thompson.

He leaves to mourn, one brother, Lawrence; a niece, Ardell Madison; and two nephews, Duane and Donnie Paulson, and other relatives and friends.
