FUNERAL SERVICES HELD MONDAY FOR MRS. E. ANDERSEN

Funeral services were held Monday, July 7th, for Mrs. Edward Andersen at 9:30 in the morning at the Idlewylde Catholic Church with Father Deragisch officiating. He also read Rosary on Sunday evening at the home. Pallbearers were Francis Andersen, Leslie Andersen, Arthur Dangel, Albert Dangel, Louis Dangel and Raymond Dangel. Interment was in the church cemetery.

Lorna Verle Jorgensen, oldest daughter of Fred E. and Anna Mellegaard Jorgensen was born April 24, 1915, at the family farm in Spring Valley township southwest of Hurley. She passed away Friday, July 4, at 5:30 P. M., at the Sacred Heart Hospital at Yankton at the age of 43 years, 2 months and 10 days.

All her life was spent in the Spring Valley and Freeman area. She attended school in Dist. No. 10 and two years in Hurley High School.

In August of 1936 she was confirmed and united with the Idlewylde Catholic Church. Sept. 1, 1936, she was united in marriage with Edward Andersen. To this union were born two daughters, Karen Kay and Mary Ann who died at birth.

Lorna was always willing to help with anything in her neighborhood and in her church whenever her health permitted. She was a member of the Altar Society of the church and several other neighborhood clubs. Most of her entire life she has patiently bore her cross of ill health but it wasn't until a year ago that she underwent major surgery and the seriousness of her illness was realized. Most of the past year has been spent at the hospital where she entered again in April and remained until her death.

Survivors include her husband, Edward, and daughter, Karen Kay, one sister, Dorothy (Mrs. Hubert Allen) of Parker, and five brothers, Milton, Dean and Dale, all of Viborg, Maurice of Hurley, and Gary just recently discharged from the Honor Guard of the U. S. Army.

Preceding her in death were her parents and infant daughter, Mary Ann. She will be greatly missed by those who loved and those who knew her.
