FUNERAL SERVICES FOR HANS KAARUP HELD HERE TUESDAY

Funeral services for Hans Kaarup were held at the Bethany Lutheran Church on Tuesday, June 20th, at 2 P.M., with Rev. G. E. Undem officiating. Mrs. Leonard Holm was organist and Yvonne Andersen, soloist. Pallbearers were Art Loe, Jens Hansen, Roy Wrage, Anton Jacobsen, Leonard Holm and Andrew Hansen. Interment was at Bethania Cemetery, with the Viborg Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Hans Kaarup was born in Sorring, Denmark, October 18, 1882. He was baptized into the Lutheran faith, and was confirmed April 7, 1901, at Dwight, Illinois. He came to America with his parents in 1892 and they settled on a farm near Dwight, Illinois.

In 1911, the family came to Viborg, South Dakota, and settled on their farm one mile south of Hooker. On December 26, 1912, Hans was united in marriage to Martha Hansen of Gardner, Illinois, and to this union three children were born.

After farming for 32 years he retired and moved to his residence here in Viborg.

Mr. Kaarup was in ill health for approximately three years, and passed away at the Pioneer Memorial Hospital in Viborg on Saturday, June 17th, at 4 P.M. at the age of 78 years and 8 months.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his wife Martha, his daughter, Helen, his sons, Raymond of Viborg and Leroy of Sioux Falls.

Hans was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, and four sisters.

He was a long time member of Bethany Church here, and may his faithfulness and faith be remembered.
