JIMMY LINEBACK DIES IN ACCIDENT

This community was shocked and saddened on Saturday when news was received of the accidental death of Jimmy Linback early that morning.

Jimmy, driving one of his father's trucks, was returning from Rapid City with a load of lumber when the accident occurred. The truck left the road, breaking down an electric light pole. According to the evidence he was not hurt in the crash but was electrocuted when he brushed against a live wire.

Jimmy William Lineback was the youngest of eight children of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Lineback, and was born at Winner, S. Dak. on December 30, 1925. At the age of two years, he moved with his parents to Turner County, coming to Viborg in 1938. He attended school in Viborg and radio schools in Aberdeen and Rapid City. He was employed in Radio at Seattle, Wash. for a few months before joining the Navy at the age of 17. He spent 27 months in the service, 18 of which were overseas in the South Pacific. He received his discharge June 14, 1946.

Military funeral services were held from the Baptist Church on Tuesday afternoon, July 16, with Rev. Morris Kildal of Beresford officiating. Interment was at the family lot in Rosehill Cemetery at Parker. Pallbearers were the two brothers and four brothers-in-law of the deceased.

He is survived by his parents; two brothers, Kenneth and Emery, Viborg; and four sisters, Mrs. Lavern Hippen and Mrs. Barry Lakings, Viborg. Mrs. Arnold Peterson, Irene, S. D., and Mrs. Harold Christenson, Vermillion, S.D. One sister, Gladys, preceded him in death in 1931.
