HERBERT LARSON KILLED

Caught Under Load of
Logs When Lock Chain
Broke and Meets In-
stant Death

FUNERAL HELD TUESDAY

The sad news reached Viborg last Saturday morning of the sudden death of Herbert Larson near Two Dot, Mont. It seems that he was engaged in hauling logs down the mountain side and in going down the lock chain on the wheel broke, shoving the load against the horses, who became frightened, upsetting the load and Herbert was caught underneath. When found several hours afterward by Bert Penny he was cold in death with his neck broken. Mr. Penny, who has a claim near Bert Larsen, telegraphed W. C. Larson of the sad occurrence and he brought the remains here Monday night. The funeral was held last Tuesday afternoon from the home and the remains were taken to the Lutheran church, where Rev. Kristensen, assisted by Rev. Folkestad, preached the funeral sermon and the remains were laid to rest in the Lutheran cemetery beside his father who died last December. Herbert was a bright young man of exemplary habits, who was honored and respected by all who knew him, as he has grown to manhood in Viborg and the great sorrow of the family is shared by the entire community. He was nearly 24 years old and was holding down a claim in Montana at the time of the accident. It seems strange that this accident should follow so close upon that of the illfated Morrison boys, as they were warm friends and schoolmates and Herbert's brother (Emil) is married to a sister of the Morrison boys. The floral offerings at the church and the grave were profuse, showing the esteem in which he was held. He leaves besides his mother, five brothers and five sisters, W. C.
