Last Rites For C. Fredericksen Held Wednesd'y

Funeral services for Carl Fredericksen, who died on Monday after an extended illness, were held on Wednesday, November 9th, at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church at 10 A.M. Business places here were closed during the services in respect for a former business associate of many years standing. Rev. Harald Ibsen officiated and the Viborg Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements. Pallbearers were P. C. Christensen, Walter Knudsen, W. C. Jensen, Louie Sanders, Andrew Petersen and Marinus Hansen. Burial was in the family plot at the Green Valley Cemetery at Homer Nebr.

OBITUARY

Carl Fredericksen was born on October 26th, 1869, in Belle Mollebak, Denmark. It was there that he spent his childhood. He emigrated to America as a young man locating at Homer, Nebraska. Shortly after his entry into Dakota County, Nebraska, he was united in marriage to Elisa Beck of Denmark, who also emigrated to America shortly after his arrival. To this union seven children were born. This union was broken by her death in 1904.

He later, with his family, moved to Viborg, South Dakota, where he established his business and resided for some thirty years.

Two following marriages were also ended by death preceding his demise. His health failing in recent years, he retired from his business in the Viborg harness and shoe repair shop. He remained a resident of Viborg and the last month has been a patient in the Viborg Hospital where his suffering ended on November 7th, having attained the age of 80 years, 11 days.

Survivors are eight children: three sons, John of Sioux Falls, S. D., Alfred of Tyler, Minn., and George of Long Beach, Calif., five daughters, Emma (Mrs. Alfred Nelson) of Long Beach, Calif., Elma (Mrs. Thomas Hartnett) of Tyler, Minn., Ida (Mrs. Lee McMahon) of Beresford, S. D., Helen (Mrs. Robert Monson) of Chicago, Ill., and Martha (Mrs. Herbert Allen) of Omaha, Nebr., who was born of his second marriage, several step-children, and grandchildren, and one sister in Denmark, also a host of friends.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Danish Lutheran faith in Denmark.
