JOE PAULSON PASSED AWAY AT SIOUX CITY HOSPITAL

The sad news was received in Viborg Monday that Joe Paulson had passed away at a hospital in Sioux City. His death was a shock to his many Viborg friends as he had only been sick a few days. He is a young man and has been farming the farm he bought a few years ago, one mile east and one and a half miles north of Viborg. He leaves a young wife and child, besides other relatives to mourn his death. We will print a full obituary next week.

OBITURARY

Joseph Paul Paulson was born on a farm 12 miles west of Viborg on Dec. 13th, 1893 and at death was 28 years, 5 months, and 15 days old.

At the age of 6, the family moved to Centerville where they lived four years, and then to Faulkton, where they remained 7 years. In 1910 they moved to the Beresford vicinity.

June 15, 1915, he was married to Miss Bertha Hattervig. They lived west of Beresford two years and at their present home near Viborg the last five years. They were blessed with one son, Milton Duane, who is now 2 years, 4 months old.

Joseph was so strong and healthy

—never knew what it was to be sick until one Tuesday evening 2 weeks before his death, when he was stricken with a high fever which would not yield to the best efforts of doctor and nurse. Monday night the 22nd of May, he was removed to a hospital in Sioux City, where he passed away at noon, Sunday the 28th of May.

The deceased had the reputation of being a good and helpful neighbor, a tender, affectionate husband and father, faithful in church attendance. At the hospital he turned to the Lord, and testified that he knew he was saved and satisfied to go.

The bereft ones are his wife and son; father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Iver Paulson, of Sioux City; 5 brothers and six sisters. The brothers are Ludvig and Bennie at Faulkton, Theodore and Maurice at Sioux City. Alvin has been staying here with Joseph. The sisters are Gunda at Canton, Emma (Mrs. E. Halvorson) and Calara (Mrs. Ed Holmberg) at Faulkton; Lavina, Dorothy and Thelma at Sioux City. One sister, Lillian died 3 years ago at the age of 19 years.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon May 31st at the residence and at the church at Hooker, conducted by his pastor, Rev. H. M. Solem, of Lennox, assisted by Rev. A. E. Distad, of Sioux City. Interment at the Hattervig Cemetery west of Hooker.

The Pall bearers were his four brothers Ludvig, Bennie, Theodore, and brothers in law, Thomas and C. O. Hattervig.
